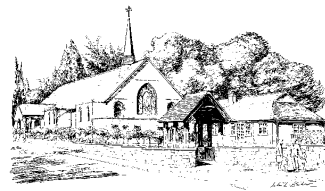

## **URGENT STOP ASSISTED SUICIDE**

**The Bishops of England Wales are asking EVERY CATHOLIC TO OPPOSE THIS MORAL EVIL. This is the biggest threat to a true vision of the sacredness and value of every human life as a person made in the image of God since the introduction of the abortion act.**

In the documentary, Liz travels to Canada to examine the impact of one of the world's most extreme assisted suicide laws. She does an excellent job of bringing the serious danger of introducing assisted suicide to life and making a strong case against introducing similar legislation in the UK.

The experience of other countries illustrates the "slippery slope" of assisted suicide legislation, with nations and states progressing towards a more wide ranging provision of assisted suicide over time. Indeed, an article published on 5 October in The Telegraph newspaper highlighted that a group of 54 cross-party MPs are already believed to be campaigning for the Bill to expand to include those who are "incurably suffering".

When questioned about the possibility of assisted suicide legislation and provision expanding over time, Ms Leadbeater said "Wherever a law has been introduced in other countries and it's got strict limited criteria with proper safeguards and protections, it hasn't been widened. So there is a perception that's the case but it isn't the case".

This view is firmly contested by charity Right to Life which reports that: "a review of the assisted suicide data from Oregon over the last 25 years, published by leading academics in the journal BMJ Supportive & Palliative Care, suggests that since the law was introduced in Oregon [it has] been interpreted to allow for wider access to assisted suicide... with patients with a range of non-cancer diagnoses receiving [physician assisted suicide for] non-terminal illnesses such as arthritis, arteritis, complications from a fall, hernia, sclerosis, 'stenosis' and anorexia nervosa".

In a Pastoral Letter issued last weekend, Cardinal Vincent Nichols said: "Be careful what you wish for. This proposed change in the law may be a source of relief to some. But it will bring great fear and trepidation to many, especially those who have vulnerabilities and those living with disabilities. What is now proposed will not be the end of the story. It is a story better not begun."
